## **Sexual Assault Investigations**

## **I. INTRODUCTION**

The purpose of this policy statement is to establish guidelines to govern the conduct of sexual assault investigations and to emphasize a compassionate and supportive approach on the part of the investigating deputy toward the victim.

## II. POLICY

- A. It is the policy of the Ridgely Police Department that the health and safety of a sexual assault victim is of paramount importance. The victim's physical condition and mental state should be immediately assessed and appropriate medical attention provided if required.
- B. It is the policy of the Ridgely Police Department that the first Officer to respond to a sexual assault has three primary responsibilities:
  - 1. Physically protect and emotionally support the victim.
  - 2. Identify, isolate and protect the crime scene.
  - 3. Conduct a quality preliminary investigation.
- C. It is the policy of the Ridgely Police Department that the investigating Officer shall candidly inform the victim what will be expected of him/her in the ensuing criminal investigation and any possible court appearance.
- D. It is the policy of the Ridgely Police Department to respect and protect the identity and confidentiality of the sexual assault victim.
  - 1. Officers/investigators should make efforts to provide a private and comfortable space for victims, especially when being asked to disclose details of their case.
  - 2. Officers/investigators should make an effort to limit the number of disclosures that need to be made.
  - 3. Officers/investigators should be aware, and advise victims if appropriate, that the details of their case can, and will, become a matter of public record

and cannot be fully protected as confidential.

- 4. The officer/investigator should provide the victim with contact information for a certified sexual assault crisis program serving the jurisdiction at the time of the initial contact.
- 5. Victims should be advised that the services provided by certified sexual assault crisis programs are confidential, and
- 6. The officer/investigator should advise victims that information discussed with any advocate from a certified sexual assault crisis program will not be shared with the investigator without the victims expressed consent.
- 7. The officer should not suggest a victim of sexually assaultive behavior sign a waiver of rights during the initial contact with the victim or during the continued investigation.
- E. It is the policy of the Ridgely Police Department to deal with all sexual assault victims in a totally considerate and sensitive manner and to conduct the investigation objectively and professionally, without any preconceived or biased judgments relating to the victim's background, personal circumstances or perceived motivation.

## **III. PROCEDURE**

- A. The principal investigating Officer shall keep the sexual assault victim informed of the progress of the investigation.
- B. The investigating Officers will clearly and patiently explain to the sexual assault victims the availability of appropriate victim assistance programs and services in the area.
- C. The investigating Officers will explain to the sexual assault victims the purpose and availability of judicial Peace Orders and Protective Orders.
- D. The investigating Officer that receives a sexual assault report shall offer the victim the opportunity to be taken immediately to the nearest designated health facility, regardless of the type or degree of sexual assault reported. See: Annotated Code of Maryland, Article 27, 790.
- E. On first contact with a sexual assault victim, the investigating Officer shall give the victim a copy of the Crime Victims and Witness pamphlet describing the victims' rights, services and procedures, before and after the filing of a charging document other than an indictment or information in Circuit Court.
- F. The officer/investigator should be aware of the potential to re-traumatize the victim when conducting follow-up contacts.

- G. If a victim requests that the scope of an investigation be limited or that an investigation be temporarily or permanently suspended, the Ridgely Police Department shall thoroughly document this request, and;
  - 1. The officer/investigator should inform the victim that the officer, or an officer within the agency who investigates sexual assaults, will follow-up with the victim within 30 days of the initial contact to confirm the victim continues to request the suspension of the investigation and the officer/investigator will discuss how and when follow-up contact will be made.
  - 2. Victims should be given the opportunity to indicate the preferred manner in which contact will be made via phone, e-mail, mail, or inperson.
  - 3. If the victim would like to be contacted by phone, the officer/investigator should determine if a voicemail can be left and with what information.
  - 4. The officer should document the victim's preference in the report.
  - 5. The officer/investigator should provide the victim with the appropriate contact information for the law enforcement agency and/or assigned investigator.
  - 6. Victims should be advised to contact the agency, or assigned investigator, at any time, with questions about their case; and/or if they have decided to pursue a criminal investigation.
- H. The officer/investigator should follow-up with the victim no later than 30 days following the initial contact. If the victim continues to request a suspension of the investigation:
  - 1. The officer/investigator should provide contact information for the appropriate individual or unit at the time of the follow-up;
  - 2. The officer should request the victim advise the agency if a decision has been made to continue the investigation or to continue the decision to suspend the investigation.
- I. The officer should advise the victim any decision to suspend an investigation will not be considered permanent and, should the victim choose to pursue a criminal investigation at a later date, the case may be re-opened for investigation.
  - 1. The officer/investigator should again provide contact information and should provide information for a certified sexual assault crisis program serving the jurisdiction.
  - 2. The officer should notify the victim of any statute of limitations.
  - 3. The officer should document this contact in the appropriate record.
